CALL TO WORSHIP

CHILDREN'S MESSAGE: NEW CITY CATECHISM

Question 34:

Since we are redeemed by grace alone, through Christ alone, must we still do good works and obey God's Word?

Answer:

Yes, because Christ, having redeemed us by his blood, also renews us by his Spirit; so that our lives may show love and gratitude to God; so that we may be assured of our faith by the fruits; and so that by our godly behavior others may be won to Christ.

1 Peter 2:9-12 - But you are a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, a people for his own possession, that you may proclaim the excellencies of him who called you out of darkness into his marvelous light. Once you were not a people, but now you are God's people; once you had not received mercy, but now you have received mercy. Beloved, I urge you as sojourners and exiles to abstain from the passions of the flesh, which wage war against your soul. Keep your conduct among the Gentiles honorable, so that when they speak against you as evildoers, they may see your good deeds and glorify God on the day of visitation.

READINGS

SCRIPTURE

¹⁹ Therefore, brothers, since we have confidence to enter the holy places by the blood of Jesus, ²⁰ by the new and living way that he opened for us through the curtain, that is, through his flesh, ²¹ and since we have a great priest over the house of God, ²² let us draw near with a true heart in full assurance of faith, with our hearts sprinkled clean from an evil conscience and our bodies washed with pure water. ²³ Let us hold fast the confession of our hope without wavering, for he who promised is faithful. ²⁴ And let us consider how to stir up one another to love and good works, ²⁵ not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another, and all the more as you see the Day drawing near.

PROFESSION OF FAITH: THE NICENE CREED

We believe in one God, the Father Almighty,

whose kingdom shall have no end.
And we believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord and giver of life,
who proceeds from the Father and the Son;
who with the Father and the Son together
is worshipped and glorified;
who spoke by the prophets;
and we believe in one holy catholic* and apostolic church;
we acknowledge one baptism for the remission of sins;
and we look for the resurrection of the dead,
and the life of the world to come. Amen

Hebrews 10:19-25

Reconnecting involves faith, hope, and love... (Hebrews 10:19-21)

How do these qualities get worked into our relationships in fresh ways?

As our faith is tested... (Hebrews 10:22)

REFLECTION QUESTIONS (taken in part from the Serendipity Study Bible for Groups)

- What experiences in your life best describe or illustrate the images of faith, hope, and love?
- Read Hebrews 10:19-39. Describe some of the immediate context for Hebrews 10:24-25. What made not meeting so attractive?
- In Hebrews 10:22-24 the author exhorts his readers toward the three cardinal Christian virtues of faith, hope, and love (1 Corinthians 13:13; 1 Thessalonians. 1:3, 5:8). In what ways are each of these virtues tied to the work of Jesus Christ the great High Priest?
- According to the author, Christian perseverance is a community endeavor (Hebrews 10:25). By what means, and for what purpose, does the author argue for community-encouraged perseverance?
- How have you been stirred up to love and good works by others in your group? How can you similarly stir up others in your group?
