SERMON OUTLINE

Your Kingdom Come

Luke 11:1; Matthew 6:9-13

When you pray, pray like this...

Not - "MY kingdom come" (Mark 4:30-32; Mark 10:35-38, 42-45)

Rather - "YOUR Kingdom come" (Mark 10:42-45; Acts 28:30-31)

— REFLECTION QUOTES —

It (the prayer) asks for the establishment of the Kingdom of God, by God for us, not by us for God.

Many Christians pray mechanically for God's kingdom (for missionaries, the church, and so on), but all the while their lives are wrapped up in their own kingdoms. You can't add God's kingdom as an overlay to your own.

Where you see healing and restoration of what sin and death have disfigured, there you see God's kingship displayed.
